



From the Registers: Funeral 20 February, Ernest William (Bill) Quick aged 86. Bill was born at Lower Burston, When he was four he, with his parents Lewis and Lucy, his sister Margaret and brother Lewis, moved to Loosebeare Manor where he spent the rest of his life. Bill was a farmer through and through, he bred and showed both Limousin cattle and Texel sheep all over the country gaining many championships. He was also a judge bringing all his experience to bear. On meeting Bill, whatever was being said, the conversation soon turned to the subject of sheep.

His funeral was attended by a large number of fellow farmers, breeders and friends from far and wide. His sons Paul, Andrew, Mark and Emma's partner Russell were the bearers, Paul gave a reading and Bill's grandchildren, Alex and Becky, gave the eulogy. The first hymn was 'Lead us, heavenly Father, lead us', which was sung at Bill and Marian's wedding in 1962. The Prebendary Anthony Geering conducted the service. Bill was laid to rest in the graveyard near his parents. We continue our prayers for Marian and the family.

In April, the garden springs to life with vibrant blooms, follow these helpful tips from Bow Garden Centre

- 1. April is a great time to sow seeds for vegetables, flowers, and herbs. Bow Garden Centre has a great varied range in store to choose from.
- 2. Plant Summer-flowering bulbs, if not done already.
- 3. If planting new trees, roses or shrubs use Mycorrhiza (a symbiotic fungus) to ensure healthy root growth, Empathy Rootgrow is available at Bow Garden Centre.
- 4. Prepare beds for the growing season. Dig in at least a 5cm layer of compost, and work in a general-purpose fertiliser, such as 6x, Growmore, or Fish, Blood and Bone.
- 5. If you haven't done so already, cut back any dead foliage on perennials and ornamental grass plants to make way for new growth.
- 6. Honeysuckle and Clematis will be putting on growth now, so tie new stems to train them along their supports.
- 7. Protect fruit blossom from late frosts by covering them with horticultural fleece on cold nights.
- 8. Continue deadheading spring bulbs and bedding, so they don't waste energy setting seed.
- 9. Make good use of April Showers... Attach guttering to sheds and greenhouses and install water butts. Rainwater is much less harsh on plants, as it doesn't contain the chemicals that tap water does.
- 10. Most importantly, take time to enjoy your garden. April is a beautiful month filled with the promise of new growth and colourful blooms, so sit back & admire your work.
