

Garden advice courtesy of Bow Garden Centre.

- 1. Recycle your Christmas tree by shredding it for mulch.
- 2. Dig over any vacant plots that have not been dug already. Turning the soil will expose pests to hungry birds, helping you keep your pest population under control.
- 3. Protect any tender plants with fleece or take them into the greenhouse.
- 4. Prune Apple and Pear trees while they are dormant, between leaf fall and bud burst, and apply Winter tree wash and pheromone moth traps. Now is a great time to do this.
- 5. Use this time to carry out any repair work in your garden. Fix fences, garden gates and furniture now, ready for the Spring.
- 6. Take a walk around your Winter garden, and look for gaps where you could add some Winter colour.
- 7. Plan, plan! Whilst you've got some time spare, take a minute to plan your garden for Spring time planting. Bow Garden Centre have a large selection of seeds and bulbs in store to choose from, so you can start planning now.
- 8. Get your propagation needs now such as seed compost, plant pots and trays. Be prepared so that you are ready to get ahead for the season.
- 9. If you have planted potatoes in planters take them into the greenhouse to avoid them getting frost damage.
- 10. Continue to provide food and water for birds. It's particularly hard for them this time of year with the cold weather conditions and reduction in the number of food sources accessible to them.

ZEAL MONACHORUM PARISH COUNCIL

The last Parish Council meeting was held on November 30th. There was a good turnout considering the bitterly cold evening.

There was one vacancy on the council. Joss Birchwhite had put his name forward for cooption. This was approved by the meeting. We are sure he will do much to help the parish. It was also necessary to elect a member of the Parish Council to sit on the village hall committee as a vacancy had occurred. Peter Heal's name was put forward and he agreed to stand.

During the open forum the subject of Parish Council members being approachable through their email addresses was raised. Mike Bostock was present and agreed to put them on the parish web site. So, if anyone wishes to contact members, the web site is where they should be. It may take a little while.

Requests to update local footpaths and especially the replacing of stiles with more accessible gates were forwarded to the district council.

There was a request read out from Bow Parish Council requesting that we make over some of our 106 money allocation to them for the extension of their new cycle track. They pointed out that this facility was available to children living in Zeal Monachorum. It was decided that, as we were in the process of trying to obtain some of this money for the replacement of the fishing hut and the shelter for the Jubilee Seat, now was not the time to make a donation.

Complaints were made about the persistent excessive amount of rubbish being left around the bin at Wootentop, even though the bin was emptied every week. As with most areas, the amount of rubbish discarded out of vehicles seems to be increasing. It doesn't make a good impression of the parish. Any suggestions? There were 3 planning applications to consider, 2 were recommended for approval. For the addition of solar panels at Hayne a vote of no comment was passed.

The next meeting will be on January 25th 2024 at 7.00pm.


