

#### FARMING FROM THE HEDGE

Planting 100% cotton pants, a memorable way to discover the health of the soil in your garden or fields and spark conversations with your neighbours and friends on how to manage the natural resources of the land!

Healthy soil is hungry soil. During 60 plus days, the millions of tiny life forms in your soil will get to work eating the cellulose sugar of which cotton is made up and start decomposing the cotton item you have buried.



Sterile, lifeless soil will have little effect, but organically thriving soil will leave nothing but the elastic of your pants. Bury anything 100% cotton, pants, tee shirts, cloth eight inches deep. Leave the items undisturbed for at least 60 days, the drier the soil the longer you will need to leave them for the microbes to thrive. Then dig up the items and proudly hang them out on display for all to see.

## Land Rover Series One 86" Station Wagon

This is the story of one of David Bowyer's Land Rovers - **7902 DF**. This vehicle was dispatched to the RAF from the Solihull factory in November 1955, and was demobbed in 1963. After several owners, it was purchased in 1975 by Rev. Andrew Stevens, a vicar from Chewton Mendip, Somerset; he used DF as a daily runabout around the seven parishes that he looked after. Originally built as a hardtop, Andrew spent a year making the vehicle roadworthy and changing it into a seven-seater Station Wagon to give better visibility with rear seats and a rear door.

DF is not original; Andrew drove **DF** for 42 years before he retired and, during that time, covered 180,000 miles. He carried out many modifications and changes to ensure reliability, ease of maintenance and usability in modern traffic. All the components used to make these changes are original Land Rover items.

The changes include: galvanising an original 86" chassis during the mid-Nineties, fitting a 2½ Litre 3 bearing Series 3 engine with a 9:1 compression ratio reengineered cylinder head, gas flowed inlet manifold with a 1¾" SU carburettor, K & N air filter and a 4 branch exhaust manifold giving around 100 brake horse power. Other changes included: later Series 2A gearbox with hydraulic clutch and transfer case, Series 2 axles with fully floating bearings and front disc brakes developed for the Series 3 Santana Land Rover in Spain. (Editor's note – this is English, but not as most of us know it).

A great number of other improvements have also been made, many by Andrew Stevens and even more by the present owner, **David Bowyer**, who has owned **DF** since August 2020. Andrew was a co-founder of **The Land Rover Series One Club** in 1979 and David joined the club soon after. The club has over 3,000 members and, if you are interested in early Land Rovers, contact David for details of this wonderful club, which includes a comprehensive spares shop.

# Take a look at these tips on what needs doing in the garden this month, courtesy of Bow Garden Centre

- 1. Mow your lawn at least once a week. Feed regularly and re-seed larger areas, use a spreader for an even spread (and water during dry spells).
- 2. Plant up hanging baskets, make sure you use water retaining granules and a slow-release feed to help them flourish all summer. Fill any empty containers you have with new summer bedding.
- 3. Pinch out your tomatoes regularly, harvest any lettuce, radish and early potatoes and any other salads that are ready. Feed with 'Tomorite', or all purpose feed.
- 4. Get summer ready and make any major changes to your garden such as new patios, garden buildings, and furniture.
- 5. Water plants regularly to ensure they grow and bloom. Invest in a Hozelock automatic watering system to ensure the job is done early mornings and late evenings, when the sun is down.
- 6. Cut back spring-flowering perennials, to encourage fresh foliage.
- 7. Start to pick sweet peas as soon as they flower, and dead-head roses if they are a repeat-flowering variety to encourage more blooms.
- 8. Remove any dead foliage from spring flowering bulbs, with the exception of daffodils and tulips which could be left a little longer, but do take off any seed-heads that may appear. If possible, it is best to allow the foliage to die back naturally.
- 9. Keep the greenhouse well ventilated during the day as temperature fluctuations caused by hot temperatures in the day, then cool at night could affect tomato plants fruiting.
- 10. Stay on top of weeding so your plants don't have to compete for water & nutrients.
