## LOCAL ELECTRICITY DISCOUNT SCHEME (LEDS)

The Local Electricity Discount Scheme, or LEDS, offers residential, commercial and community properties closest to RES wind farms an annual discount off their electricity bill.

LEDS at Den Brook was launched in May 2014 and offers properties within 2.3km of the turbines an annual discount (currently worth £135.00 p.a.) which is paid direct to their electricity supplier. Eligible properties were contacted in 2014, but those moving in since then may not know about the scheme (which is NOT a means tested grant). Further details about LEDS can be found here: www.res-leds.com

The Portal asks for a Unique Reference Number which is obtainable by Email at leds@res-group.com. They will then check your eligibility. If you do not have internet access, ring 0141 404 5555. Office Opening Hours are Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday 9.30am - 2.30pm

It is important to register on the website by November in order to qualify for the payment which is usually made in February each year. All unclaimed grant monies are transferred to the Den Brook Community Fund for use by local community groups.

#### **ZEAL MONACHORUM W.I.**

It was Zeal WI's turn to host the WI Group Meeting this month with nearly 60 people attending from the five local Institutes. There were a few hiccups: our President was ill and the speaker cancelled at the last minute but the Committee, Vice-President, Delia Wainwright, and members dealt with the challenges. A new speaker on flower arranging was found - Lesley from Heart of Flowers Okehampton - who was very interesting. Subsequently the visitors were very complimentary about the good time they had, which had included a supper of homemade soup and desserts. The competition, a flower arrangement, was won by Coldridge WI.

Zeal's monthly meeting fell in the same week. Dr Paul Cleave gave a fascinating talk on WWII recipes and cooking. He brought a large collection of books and memorabilia from the period for members to look at. The oldest cookery book competition was won by Jackie Watson with a handwritten recipe book from 1879.

The November 1st meeting will be at the Waie Inn for skittles and a light supper starting at 7pm. Our Christmas Dinner is on 6 December.

#### November Garden Advice from Bow Garden Centre

With the glow of Autumn colours and leaves falling, a lot happens in our gardens in November. Take a look at these tips on what needs doing in the garden this November, courtesy of Bow Garden Centre

- 1. Plant Tulip bulbs now, making sure they are covered with at least twice their depth of soil or bulb fibre.
- 2. Insulate your outdoor containers to protect from frost, using bubble wrap or fleece.
- 3. Plant Shrubs, Trees, and Fruit trees; before the ground becomes too cold & wet (we have an expanded range now in).
- 4. Prune Roses to prevent windrock/ root damage by pruning them by one-third to half of their height.
- 5. Cut down perennials, allowing you to clear any weeds found, then mulch the surrounding soil with bark or Strulch Mulch.
- **6.** Cover empty vegetable beds with well-rotted organic matter during the colder months to improve soil nutrition.
- 7. Plant up a colourful display of Autumn/Winter bedding.
- 8. In case of increasing rainfall raise containers onto pot feet to prevent waterlogging.
- 9. Keep on top of leaf raking and keeping your pond clear of all debris.
- 10. Continue to supply wildlife with food and shelter as they can struggle at this time of year.

#### ZEAL MONACHORUM PARISH COUNCIL

The last Parish Council meeting was held on 28th September. Before starting the meeting, councillors stood in silence to pay our respects to the late Ken Down. He was a Parish Councillor for 40 years, 25 as chairman, tremendous devotion. Both members of Mid Devon and County council sent their apologies. This was obviously unavoidable but nonetheless disappointing as we needed advice on several matters.

The following issues were discussed:

- The shelter for the Jubilee seat is now in place and paid for. The Clerk agreed to continue pursuing 106 funds for the project. The next target is refurbishing the seat.
- A request was made to the Highways Dept to repair the broken village sign at Hayne. Concern was raised about the number of over large lorries getting stuck in the village. The Clerk agreed to ask the Highways Dept to re-install the original restriction signage at Stopgate Cross.
- We had been informed that the seat at Wootton Top had now completely collapsed; the Council agreed that we should provide a replacement.
- People in the village had informed the council that there was, from time to time, excessive anti-social behaviour in the form of cars racing through the village. Usually, late Friday evenings and early Saturday mornings. We agreed to request an occasional police presence when we next see the County Councillor.
- It has been suggested that safety outside the village hall would be improved by the presence of Road Wardens during events. Two volunteers were approved by the council and are now awaiting training.
- A member of the public had requested that all parish councillors should make their email addresses available. There were many problems of privacy and potential scamming raised. It was thought there may be a way round this and the idea will be put on the agenda for the next meeting.




